ANNUAL REPORT 2015-16



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I. INTRODUCTION

Budget Analysis Rajasthan Centre (BARC), Jaipur is a programme of Astha, Udaipur. It was set-up in 2003 as a budget study and policy research centre with the aim to analyze the state government budget to understand its policies and examine if the commitments made by the government at various forums (policy documents, election manifestos, and at international forums) are matched by the financial provisions in the state budget.

Increasing hardship of the people, particularly of the underprivileged people, in face of economic liberalization has been confirmed by many studies, including one conducted by Astha, itself. One of the roles of civil society organizations in this scenario is to ensure that the governments do not withdraw from the social sector and the development schemes meant for the weaker sections. For this, Budget analysis is an important technique. It helps to keep an eye on the allocations made to various schemes and programmes meant for poor and marginalized in the society.

BARC, therefore, has been involved in analyzing the state budget with a perspective of poor and marginalized and has been using its analysis to further the issues and concerns raised by many civil society organizations by highlighting the short comings in the budget for the poorer sections, dalits, tribals, women and children and for important social services like, health, education, social security schemes for widows, for elderly, for unorganized workers etc.

Working as a resource centre for the NGOs, POs, media and civil society and creating a pool of budgetary information/ data are some of the major activities of BARC. It provides data, analysis, training and resources in training workshops to many organizations across the state and even outside the state of Rajasthan.

II. CORE OBJECTIVES OF BARC

The above background has given shape to the following objectives of BARC:

- Bringing about the changes in budget and policies of the government of Rajasthan which affect underprivileged men and women in the state, in both urban and rural areas;
- Facilitating public discourses on budget governance issues, encouraging citizen's participation in budget governance and advancing the rights of the deprived;
- Advocating for a pro-people, pro-poor and pro-marginalized perspective in budget allocations;

- Demystifying the budget by making it and the other budget related documents, transparent, user friendly and readable by the public;
- Examining budget spending trends and impact of budget policies on the poor;
- Bringing about awareness in the civil society organizations on how the budget analysis could be used to change the policies/programmes and budget allocations as well;
- Helping civil society organizations to learn how to strengthen their advocacy and lobbying work by using budget data.

III. FOCUS AREAS OF BARC

BARC focuses on the following core areas for its work:

- Women/gender Rights
- Dalit and Tribal rights
- Child rights
- Minority rights
- Social Sector: Education, Health, Water and sanitation
- Social Security
- Agriculture and allied activities
- Food security
- ULB and Panchayat Budget and Planning

IV. ACTIVITIES DURING 2015-16

In the year 2015-16 various analysis, research and advocacy related activities have been undertaken by BARC in line with its objectives and focus areas. The following pages will provide brief information about these activities:

A. Budget Advocacy

Pre- Budget Advocacy

Every year BARC does Pre- Budget advocacy for increasing the understanding and participation of people in the budgeting process. The Pre Budget Advocacy is done with the Rajasthan government by involving NGOs, CBOs, unions and associations functioning across Rajasthan; conducting pre-budget workshop with the MLAs of Rajasthan by giving suggestions and raising demands for the upcoming budget at both Centre and State. BARC

also participates actively in the pre-budget advocacy on the union budget with the Union government by the People's Budget Initiative (PBI).

Pre- Budget Consultation on State Budget: This year the state level pre budget consultation was held on 1-2 February 2016, at the Institute of Development Studies (IDS) Jaipur to discuss the issues, concerns as well as expectations and suggestions for the Budget 2015-16. Representatives of more than 60 NGOs and CBOs from various parts of Rajasthan participated in the consultation and several demands were raised by the participants.

A Charter of Demands was prepared by collecting demands from both consultations with primary focus on issues related to health, women, children, dalits, tribals and rural areas. This Charter of Demands was then sent to the Chief Minister, Chief Secretary, Department of finance and other concerned departments. Some of the demands from the

Charter of Demands found place in the Budget Speech of the Chief Minister and also BARC received acknowledgements and response to the Charter of Demands from some departments including the Finance Department.

Participation in the Pre Budget Consultation organized by the Government: BARC

participated in the Pre-Budget Consultation organized by the Department of Finance, Government of Rajasthan, with the Non-Government Organizations in the State. During this consultation BARC presented its Charter of Demands and gave suggestions for the budget 2016-17.

Pre- Budget MLA workshop: Every year BARC conducts a workshop for the MLAs of the

state before the state budget is presented in the Vidhan Sabha. This year the MLA workshop was conducted on March 5th, 2016 at Pant Krishi Bhavan, Jaipur. In this workshop, 37 representatives from various NGOs persons and 5 MLAs participated and various issues related to state budget, finances and development were discussed in the workshop.

Pre- Budget advocacy with the Union Government: BARC is a part of People's Budget Initiative (PBI) and has contributed in PBI's efforts of pre- budget advocacy with the union government.

Formation of District-level Budget Groups:

BARC has formed two District-level Budget Groups in Udaipur and Alwar districts to carry on the deepening of the Budget studies and analysis work at the district level and below. Both the Budget Groups are expected to prepare charter of demands and expectations for Drstrict and below level planning and budgeting.

In Udaipur the District-level Budget Group was formed on June 29th, 2015 in a meeting conducted by BARC with the support of Astha Sansthan, Udaipur. In this meeting 15 representatives of various NGOs participated. In Alwar this group was formed on July 7th, 2015 in a meeting conducted by BARC with the support of NGOs in which 20 representatives of various NGOs participated. Apart from formation of the District-level Budget Groups, the objectives, issues and the procedure of working for both the groups were also decided in both the meetings.

On September 8th, 2015, a second meeting for the District-Level Budget Group, Udaipur was conducted in Udaipur with help of Astha. Secand meeting at Alwar dist. Budget group was organised on Sept. 30, in which an a disussion on stracture of the state budget was conducted as well as the participants raised various issues relavant to the Alwar dist. which they agreed to raise when the government budget making process starts. Some of these suggestions could be included in the Charter of Demands prepared by BARC.

Post Budget Activities

Budget Analysis

For the year 2015-16 the budget was presented by the state government in March 2015. Like every year, BARC carried on analyzing the State Budget from the perspective of poor and

marginalized. BARC studied, analyzed and shared the data and information with media, various CSOs and MLAs. Along with the analysis of budget and policies towards the social and economic development of the state, BARC also analyzed the budget for SCs, STs (SC-SP and TSP budget), minorities groups, children, and women (gender budget). Many newspapers used the information provided by BARC while reporting about the State Budget. An analysis of the State Budget 2015-16 was also published in the April-June 2015 issue of *Budget Samachar*, BARC's quarterly newsletter.

Similarly, the budget for the present financial year 2016-17 which was presented by the State Government in March 2016 was also analyzed and this analysis has been shared with various Media, NGOs and MLAs. A detailed analysis of the Budget was also published in the Budget Samachar in the January to March, 2016 issue. The articles and write ups of the BARC team members on the analysis of the State Budget were also published by some major newspapers in the state and this analysis is also being used by other NGOs for their advocacy work.

Post Budget Advocacy

BARC undertook post- budget advocacy activities by sharing the analysis of the State budget, 2015-16 with the media, researchers, civil society organizations and MLAs. Notes for the budget for various sectors like, agriculture, health, Panchayat, rural development, minority affairs, education, gender budget etc. were prepared and shared. As a result of this, MLAs used BARC's analysis of the budget data and raised few questions in the Vidhan Sabha on Agriculture, SCSP and TSP during the budget debate.

Meeting with the CS on GRB in Rajasthan: Representatives from UN Women and BARC jointly had a meeting with the Chief Secretary of the State and discussed issues in the Gender Budget and budgeting for women and presented their suggestions to the government.

B. Deepening of the Budget Work

BARC has been trying to deepen the budget work to the district level and to local governing bodies. Apart from the budget tracking studies there is a need to have direct involvement with the PRIs and district administration. This year BARC has conducted studies and has engaged with the local bodies for deepening the budget work the broad objective of increasing participation in panchayat planning and budgeting process as well as effective inclusion of issues of marginalized sections like tribal, dalit and women farmers in the PRIs planning and budgeting.

Capacity Building on Panchayat Budget

Panchayat finances and planning is one of the focus areas of BARC. Data on the resources (funds) that are being delegated to the PRIs and ULBs by the state have been compiled by BARC and shared every year. In 2014, a Panchayat Budget Manual was prepared and shared with many NGOs and Panchayat representatives and a capacity building workshop was organized for the members of panchayats to understand the budgeting process and participate in order to make the planning and budgeting better and stronger at Panchayat level. BARC also provided resource in the capacity building workshops on panchayati raj system organized by other organizations like The Hunger Project.

Study of Panchayat Plan and Budget in Bihar: With support of Save the Children, Bihar, BARC conducted a study on panchayat budget and planning of the selected gram panchayats of Rajgir District of Bihar. BARC also conducted a training programme for the elected representatives of the panchayats of Rajgir District of the State of Bihar. This programme was conducted for Save the Children, Bihar.

Working with the Panchayats

BARC worked with select panchayats to support them in planning and budgeting in the district of Alwar for making the Budgeting and Panchayat Planning process more effective with in collaboration with Sohard, a Community Based Organization in the area. The process included forming groups of local volunteers in two panchayats of Neemrana Block, conducting capacity building workshops for the volunteers, elected representatives of panchayat and people, situation analysis of the study areas, collection of demands from the people of the panchayats and separately from the youth, women and the elderly, compiling the demands and preparing plans for both the panchayats, and finally presenting the plans in the Gram Sabhas and getting them approved.

C. Budget Tracking and Research Studies

Every year BARC conducts some studies with the purpose of making an assessment of the impact of the government policies and expenditures on the poor and marginalized section of the society. These studies give the actual situations at the grass root level and provide potential entry points for advocacy and better implementation of the government policies. The budget tracking studies provide information about the use of the funds allocated by the government for the welfare of the beneficiaries. Apart from this, BARC also conducted a

study to find the status of transparency in State Budget at district level. These studies are as follows:

a. Marginalized sections and budget

• Gender Responsive Budget and Marginalized women:

With the support of Christian Aid, BARC has completed a study on "Gender Responsive Budget and Policies towards Women of Marginalized Communities" in India focusing on Rajasthan. The report writing for the study has been completed and will soon be published.

• Gender Responsive Planning and Budgeting in Agriculture Sector in Rajasthan: BARC undertook a project for studying the status of women farmers and farm workers in Rajasthan and the planning and budgeting process in agriculture in Rajasthan with the support of UN Women through National Foundation for India. This study was conducted in two blocks of Rajsamand district. The report of this study has been completed and submitted to National Foundation for India.

b. Budget Tracking Studies

• Budget Tracking Study of Tribal Sub Plan:

BARC has conducted a Budget Tracking Study on the implementation of the Tribal Sub Plan in partnership with Astha Sansthan, Udaipur. The report of this study been completed and is under final editing stage.

• Budget Tracking Study of the Scheduled Caste Sub Plan:

BARC has started a Budget Tracking Study on the implementation of the Scheduled Caste Sub Plan in partnership with Jai Bhim Vikas Shikshan Sansthan, Jodhpur. The report of this study been completed and is under final editing stage.

• Status of Health Services in Rajasthan:

BARC conducted a study on the Study of Health Services and budget utilization in Rajasthan in collaboration with Jan Swasthya Abhiyan (People's Health Movement) and Prayas in four districts- Pratapgarh, Jhunjhunu, Barmer and Bharatpur. The study was conducted with the help of the partner organizations in each district. This study analyses the health budget, health systems and health service delivery at district hospitals, CHCs, PHCs and Sub-Centre levels in the four districts of Rajasthan. The report of the study has been prepared and would be uploaded on the website soon.

D. Budget Transparency

Study on Budget Transparency at the district level: BARC has been advocating for Budget Transparency at the State and district levels since long as Rajasthan has been found to be one of the poor performing states in budget transparency according to a study done by BARC with CBGA in 2011. This year a study on budget transparency at district level was conducted in collaboration with School of Democracy for mapping and benchmarking the budget transparency standard norms at the district level. The study was done in the Rajsamand District. The report of this study been completed and will soon be published.

F. Advocacy Material-

• A Standard of Discloser of Budget Documents:

Based on the study done by BARC on budget transparency at district level, a document on Standard of Discloser of Budget Documents has been prepared which must be available to ensure budget transparency in the state. This document has been published on BARC's website.

• Training Module on Economic and Budget Literacy:

BARC has prepared a module on Economic and Budget Literacy with the support of Action Aid, Delhi. The final draft has been submitted to the publisher and the module is under the process of publishing at present.

• Policy brief on health:

BARC has prepared a policy brief on Health services and Health Budget in Rajasthan. This policy brief summarizes the findings of the state-wide study conducted by BARC in collaboration with Prayas and JSA to analyse health budget, health system and health delivery in Rajasthan.

• District health reports:

BARC has prepared four District Health Reports for Barmer, Bharatpur, Chittorgarh and Jhunjhunu districts. Each of these reports presents the findings of the respective districts from the state-wide study conducted by BARC in collaboration with Prayas and JSA to analyse health budget, health system and health delivery in the districts such as, the District hospitals, community health centres (CHCs), primary health centres (PHCs) and sub centres (SCs).

G. Conferences and workshops-

BARC conducted following conferences and workshops during the year 2015-16:

Budget Training:

 BARC along with JSA and Prayas conducted a capacity building workshop at ICM, Jaipur on March 29th, 2016 on understanding the state and

presesenting various organisations and members of JSA participated in the workshop.

 BARC, in collaboration with CBGA, conducted a capacity building workshop on Mother and Child Health Budget and Policies in Rajasthan for the members of SUMA Network on February 22-24, 2016.

- Conducted a workshop on Transparency in Budget and Right to Information with the support of MKSS and School of Democracy at the SfD campus.
- BARC conducted a workshop on Budget Analysis and Budget Tracking for the students of Department of Social Work, Department of Economics and Department of Public Policy of Central University of Rajasthan, Kishangarh on September 17th, 2015. In this workshop 35 students and teachers participated. Apart from the basic concepts of budgeting, the State budget and the Central Budget were also discussed during the workshop with the help of presentations and group-work.

Workshops and Seminars on Budget issues

- BARC, along with Accountability Initiative and SPRI, conducted a workshop on July 3rd on the impact of 14th Finance Commission on the financial state and social sector of Rajasthan.
- A one-day workshop was conducted for sharing the findings of the study on the Status

Mining and Mine of Workers in Rajasthan. The meeting was conducted on July 21^{st} , 2015 at IDS, Jaipur and almost 55 representatives of various organizations and government departments participated in the workshop.

 A one-day workshop was conducted on August 27th 2015 with the support of JSA and Prayas Sansthan. Findings of the study conducted on health budget for health services in Rajasthan was presented in the workshop.

Meetings of the Advisory Group:

This year, the first meeting of the advisory group of BARC was conducted in June 15th, 2015 and second meeting was conducted on October 6th, 2015. Advisory Group members, Shri P.R. Sharma, Shri Virendra Shrimali and Shri Satish Kumar participated in these meeting and discussed about the advocacy for making Panchayat planning and budgeting and stronger and more impactful. Apart from this, ways for making BARC's work better and wider were also discussed in these meetings.

V. COLLABORATION, PARTICIPATION AND NETWORKING

At national level, BARC is an active member of People's Budget Initiative (PBI), a network of a few hundred civil society organizations from across the country; and participates in all its activities. BARC actively participates and contributes in PBI's pre- budget regional and national consultations. Earlier BARC also was part of the joint study conducted by some PBI partners on district level fund tracking of major government schemes. We have also participated in the activities of MAKAAM, a national network of organization working with women farmers and farm workers.

At state level, BARC has always worked in collaboration with the various state level networks and organizations like Right to Food Campaign, Suchna evm Rozgar Adhikar Abhiayn, MKSS etc. There is good number of participation from state NGOs in BARC's pre budget consultations and other programmes. During the year 2015-16, BARC collaborated with many organizations for conducting various research studies and interventions as mentioned above. Apart from this; BARC also participated in various meetings, seminars and advocacy initiatives undertaken by various organizations like the following:

- Participated in the workshop conducted by CBGA and NFI on "Sustainable Development Goals and G-20".
- Participated in the workshop conducted by NFI on "The Future of Budget Work".
- Contributed Notes for People's Report Card prepared by CECOEDECON and Wada Na Todo Abhiyan for analyzing the promises made by the current State Government in its manifesto and work done in 18 months of its reign.
- Participated in the meeting conducted by Health Rights Movement supported by NFI and CBGA.
- Participated in a three-days training programme on Gender Responsive Budgeting conducted by UN Women and NFI in Bhubaneswar and in the advanced workshop in Pune.
- BARC team members provided training on Panchayat Budgeting and Planning to the participants of the organization CBM from six states.
- Participated in the workshop conducted by CBGA on "Recent Changes in Fiscal Architecture in India" and "Ten years of CBGA" in New Delhi.
- Participated in the "Partners' meet" conducted by UN Women in Kerala.
- Dr. Nesar Ahmad, Coordinator of BARC presented a research paper on "Gem Stone Industry of Jaipur and the status of the workers in this industry" in the Seminar organized by Australian National University on Informal Mining.

VI. BARC AS RESOURCE CENTRE

As stated earlier, one of the roles that BARC assumes is to be a Resource Centre for the NGOs/POs, as well as the journalists, MLAs and the public at large. The Centre was set up to

provide high quality research data and analysis to support advocacy efforts. During the year 2014-15, BARC has provided support to various organizations. Some of the organizations which requested for specific budget data and information include MKSS, PUCL, CDR, The Hunger Project, Vishakha, Visidha, Cecoedecon and SR Abhiyan as well as NCDHR, New Delhi. Apart from this, BARC conducted sessions and made presentations in various capacity buildings and awareness generation workshops organized by various organizations in the state. Beside these, BARC has had two major activities as a resource centre.

- Supporting Results for Development (R4D) in preparing a policy brief on state of Nutrition Finance in Rajasthan, and
- 2. Preparing an economic and budget literacy manual in Hindi for Action Aid

VII. PUBLICATIONS

As a resource centre, BARC continued to release various publications during the reported year. Four issues of Budget Samachar, BARC's quarterly Journal were published and more than 1000 copies have been distributed to various organizations, government departments and individuals. Along with this, a book titled "A Study on the Status of Mining and Mine Workers in Rajasthan" was also published by BARC. It also published Budget Summary, comments on the state and central budgets, suggestions and demands for the State Budget on its website. Some of the studies conducted last year are going to be published this year.

BARC continued writing for newspapers on budget and policy issues. For the present year BARC's articles appeared in Daily News, the Economic Times, Vividha Features and the Hindustan Times. The complete list of BARC's publications is provided in *Appendix 2*. Copies of every publication are sent to NGOs and POs across the state, various government departments and are also used for training and other purposes. The softcopies of BARC's publications can also be found on www.barcjaipur.org under "Publications".

Updating the website:

For greater public accessibility and availability of budget data and information at the state and district level, BARC has done a systematic compilation and digitalization of all budgetary data, documents and information available at the state and district level. BARC website also has a link to the website of Finance Department and various other relevant departments and organizations. Currently, BARC is providing simplified budget data under "Rajasthan Budget Data Simplified" on its website (<u>https://www.barcjaipur.org/?p=94</u>) in form of Rajasthan Budget Summary (major head wise, sector wise, department wise and outstanding liabilities of the government, budget for TSP, SCSP, Children etc.). All the documents have been revised after the announcement of the Budget 2016-17.

VIII. CONCLUSION

BARC has been working on the state budget and policy related issues for a more than a decade now. Its work has been able to generate much needed interest in the government budgetary process in the state. It has highlighted and continued to highlight the issues of marginalized people and the shortcomings in the budgetary process while dealing with them. It continued to raise the issues of lower allocations and expenditure under the sub-plans for tribals and dalits, lower allocation for the children, discrepancies in the gender budget statement (GBS) etc. The issues of governance, transparency and accountability are also being highlighted by BARC regularly. The budget tracking studies and district level implementation study of TSP and SC-SP have their objectives to understand the ground level problems in implementations. This year BARC has moved towards further by deepening the budget work to the district and panchayat levels. Also it has been able to work more extensively in the areas of natural resources and agriculture, land and climate change apart from focusing on the continue to raise meaningful issues and contribute to the improvement in lives of people.
