BARC TRUST: AN INTRODUCTION

The Budget Analysis and Research Centre (BARC) Trust is an independent organization working towards enhancing transparency and accountability in governance through rigorous analysis of the government's policy and budget.

BARC Trust is officially registered as a Trust on 4th March, 2015. The goal of BARC is to analyze the budget of the Rajasthan State Government, determine whether the financial commitments made by the government in the State Budget are sufficient to support the commitments made in policy documents, election manifestos, budget speeches, and international commitments, and disseminate the results through training and publications.

BARC Trust is the new avatar of Budget Analysis Rajasthan Centre (BARC), which has been setup for furtherance of Budget and Social Policy Research and Action. Originally, BARC was setup in 2003 as a budget study and policy research centre with the aim to analyze the budget and policies of the governments at all levels- Central, State and Local and examine if the commitments made at various forums (policy documents, election manifestos, budget speech and at international forums) are matched by the adequate financial provisions in the budget.

BARC has been involved in analyzing the state budget from the perspective of the poor and the disadvantaged, and it has been using its analysis to advance the issues and concerns of marginalised groups including Dalits, Tribes, Women, and Children. Through its research and training initiatives, BARC has been collaborating closely with PRIs and ULBs as well as NGOs, POs, the media, and civil society to build a pool of financial information.

VISION

BARC Trust's vision is of a policy environment that ensures rights, justice and well-being for all, especially the deprived and marginalized such as dalits, tribals, women, children, minorities and disabled. BARC Trust works with civil society, governments and media to create pro-people policies and budgetary processes.

MISSION

To simplify complicated budgetary data and key policy matters for the wider public, strengthen transparency and accountability in governance and increase capacities of marginalized groups to access government and non-government development programs.

Budget Advocacy

BARC Trust analyses the Union and State budget and conducts pre and post budget advocacy with the government and elected representatives to promote transparent, accountable and participatory governance and a people centric perspective with regards to the preparation and implementation of the budgets.

❖ Pre-Budget Advocacy

Every year, BARC Trust engages in Pre Budget-advocacy for increasing the understanding and participation of people in the budgeting process. The Pre Budget-Advocacy is done with the Rajasthan government by involving Non-Government Organizations (NGOs), Community Based Organizations (CBOs), Unions and Associations functioning across Rajasthan.

It also involves conducting a pre-budget workshop with the Members of the Legislative Assembly (MLAs) of Rajasthan by giving suggestions and raising demands for the upcoming budget at both the Centre and the State level. A pre-budget consultation with state NGOs and Civil Society is also conducted. BARC Trust participated actively in the pre-budget advocacy on the union budget with the Union government by the People's Budget Initiative (PBI).

❖ Pre-Budget Consultations

- **Participation in the Pre-Budget Consultation of Rajasthan Govt.:** BARC Trust participated in the Chief Ministers' Pre-budget Consultation organized on November 10, 2022 to take the suggestions from the CSOs and presented our suggestions and submitted a Charter of Demands for the state budget 2023-24.

❖ Post Budget Activities

Budget Analysis

- **Responding to the Budget 2022-23:** The state government presented its Budget for the year 2023-24 on February 10, 2023. After the announcement of the Budget, BARC Trust shared the analysis of the State Budget with the media, researchers, civil society organizations and MLAs. Articles on budget published in the newspaper and views were shared on the TV channels. BARC article and analysis was shared on with the CSOs and social media.

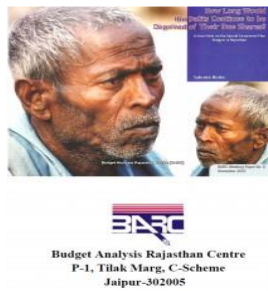
Participated the Meeting on Status and Review of Budget Announcement (2022-23) organized by the Government of Rajasthan with CSOs/NGOs (chaired by Chief Minister): BARC Trust participated the meeting on status and review of budget announcement (2022-23) organized by the Government of Rajasthan with CSOs/NGOs (chaired by Chief Minister) on review and status of budget announcement for agriculture sector on August 1, 2022. Efforts are also made to analyse the status and review of budget announcements for select social and economic sectors for 2022-23. And, the suggestions on the implementation of the announcements for food security, agriculture etc. were shared with government.

BARC Trust also participated in a similar meeting on "Benefits of Budget Announcements Reaching the People" organized by the Government of Rajasthan with CSOs/NGOs on April 14, 2023

Asking for Preparing Rules of STDF and SCDF Act, 2022:

Since its beginning BARC has been raising the issue of lower allocation towards and weak implementation of the Tribal Sub Plan (TSP) and Scheduled Caste Sub Plan (SC-SP) (earlier known as Special Component Plan) in the state. BARC- Astha had published its first report on the issue in 2007. BARC also has raised the issue with the media and the policy makers and contributed to the growing demand for the legislation for the TSP and SC-SP in Rajasthan.

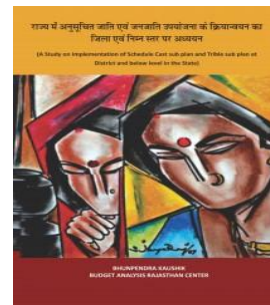

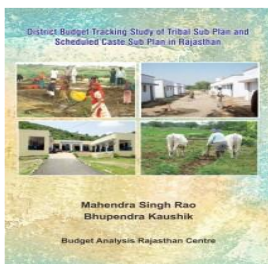

The state government in 2013 had released a draft bill on TSP and SC-SP in Rajasthan, but it could not become a law. In recent years also, the state government on various occasions including in the Budget Speech 2021-22 announced its intention to bring in the legislation for the TSP and SC-SP in Rajasthan. The state government came out with the draft bill on SC-ST legislation –The Rajasthan State Schedule Castes and Schedule Tribes Development Fund (Planning, Allocation and Utilization of Financial Resources) Bill 2022 - and invited public comments on it. Once the bill was available in the public domain, different meetings were held on the draft bill.

Finally, the government of Rajasthan also passed the **“Rajasthan State Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes Development Fund (Planning, Allocation, and Utilization of Financial Resources) Act, 2022”** in April 2022 for ensuring proper implementation of the sub-plans. BARC, along with other CSOs, continued to raise the demand for preparing the rules for **“Rajasthan State STDF and SCDF Act, 2022”** in the state. In this process BARC with Suchna evam Rozgar Abhiyan and Centre for Dalit Rights organized a one dialogues and informal discussions for preparing the rules of the Act.

- **Consultation on Rajasthan State STDF and SCDF Act, 2022:**

Centre for Dalit rights (CDR) along with BARC Trust, Rajasthan Adivaasi Adhikar Manch and others organized a one-day consultation on Rajasthan State STDF and SCDF Act, 2022 on July 29, 2022 at Ambedkar Welfare Society, Jhalana (Jaipur) comprising of 40 to 50 participants.

Campaign for Right to Health Act:

The ruling party in its manifesto had promised to come with a Right to Health act. BARC with Jan Swasthya Abhiyan (JSA) campaigned for such an act to be passed in the state. The issue was also raised in the charter of demands prepared by BARC Trust and pre-budget consultation organized by the government. In this backdrop, the GoR prepared the draft Rajasthan Right to Health Care Act 2022 on September 22, 2022 and the government uploaded the draft on the website of Directorate of Medical and Health (GoR). BARC Trust participated in the different meetings, discussions and consultations on the draft bill organized by the Jan Swasthya Abhiyan (JSA). And finally, the “Rajasthan Right to Health Care Act, 2022” is passed in the state assembly on March 21, 2023.

- **Meeting with Concerned Officials of Dept. of Medical and Health (GoR) for Submitting Suggestions on the draft Rajasthan Right to Health Care Act 2022:** BARC Trust along with Prayas Sansthan and other member of JSA held meetings with concerned officials of the Dept. of Health and Family Welfare (GoR) to make suggestions on the draft Rajasthan Right to Health Care (R Act 2022. And, BARC Trust also participated in the meeting called by the Dept. of Health and Family Welfare (GoR) on January 18, 2023.
- **Discussion on the draft Rajasthan Right to Health Care Act 2022:** BARC Trust along with Prayas Sansthan under the banner of JSA held a discussion on draft Rajasthan Right to Health Care Act 2022. The discussion was participated by the members of Jan Swasthya Abhiyan (JSA) and NGOs/CSOs and POs working on issues of health in the state.

Research Studies

Study on Gender and Perspective around Roles and Expectations from Boys and Girls in 17 Districts of Rajasthan:

BARC Trust conducted a research study on “Gender and Perspective around Roles and Expectations from Boys and Girls in 17 Districts of Rajasthan” in collaboration with National Service Scheme (NSS) with support of UNICEF Rajasthan. The main objective of the study is to understand people's understanding on the role of men and women in the society and in the

family in a post COVID situation. The study was on based survey conducted in 17 districts e.g. Alwar, Barmer, Bikaner, Bharatpur, Churu, Dholpur, Dungarpur, Dausa, Jalore, Jaipur, Jodhpur, Kota, Nagaur, Pali, Sawai Madhopur, Sri Ganganagar, Udaipur of the state.

The data was collected from 5322 sample respondents including males and females of different age-groups and social groups. The study on Perception on ‘Gender and Roles of Boys and Girls in a Post Covid Scenario in Rajasthan’ was conducted in 17 districts of Rajasthan, involving 170 NSS students of 26 colleges.

Orientation programmes were organised for all the NSS volunteers in all 17 districts before they started data collection for the study. All the orientation programmes were joined by many more than the students who took part in the data collection. In total 502 students joined the orientation workshops. The details of district-wise orientation could be seen in the below table;

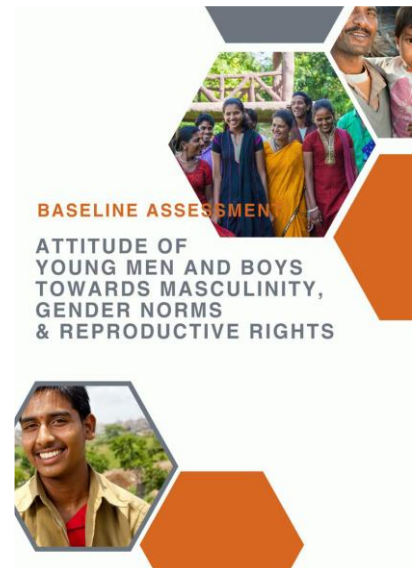


The experience sharing workshops were organised with title of “Open Forum with NSS Volunteers” in 6 colleges of the state. BARC Trust also organized a dialogue on December 27, 2022 at Hotel Ramada (Jaipur) for sharing preliminary findings on gender perceptions around roles and expectations from boys and girls in COVID-19 and way forward.



Gender Sensitivity among the Young People in Rajasthan: Baseline Assessment:

The BARC Trust conducted study on “Gender Sensitivity among the Young People in Sawai Modhopur District of Rajasthan: Baseline Assessment” initiated by CECOEDECON with support of UNFPA. Major objective of the study is to understand men’s knowledge, attitude and practices (KAP) towards sexual and reproductive health, masculinity, and gender-related issues such as gender-based violence. The sample was selected from the youth groups formed by CECOEDECON in 33 panchayats of the district and total of 154 youth/men from 33-gram panchayat were selected who are members of youth collectives for the survey study on KAP.



Mapping of Schemes and Programmes for Youth:

The BARC Trust conducted study on “Mapping of Government Schemes and Programmes for Youth in Rajasthan” initiated by CECOEDECON with support of UNFPA. And a booklet was prepared, based on mapping of government schemes and programmes for youth. The booklet details the government schemes and programmes related to education, health, nutrition, skill development and employment, social security, sports etc. meant for youths.

Status Report on Youth in Rajasthan:

BARC Trust also prepared the status report on youths in Rajasthan initiated by CECOEDECON with support of UNFPA. The status report highlights status of youth different indicators with regard to education, health, nutrition, gender issues and socio-economic indicators in the state.

Comments on Climate Change Policy of the State to Government:

The state government of Rajasthan drafted the policy on climate change of the state and uploaded it on the website of Directorate of Environment and Climate Change (GoR) for suggestion and comments. BARC Trust prepared a note for comments and suggestions on draft climate change policy of Rajasthan (2022) and submitted it to the directorate of environment and climate change (GoR)

Conferences and Workshops

The following conferences and workshops were conducted during the year 2022-23:

Orientation and Workshops under the Gender Perception Study

- **Orientation workshops of the NSS Volunteers:** BARC Trust and UNICEF in collaboration with NSS organized orientations of NSS volunteers for the study on “Gender and Roles of Boys and Girls in a Post Scenario in Rajasthan’ has been conducted in 17 districts of Rajasthan”.
- **Dialogue with students on Gender Perception in a Post Covid-19 Scenario in Rajasthan and Engaging with NSS Volunteers in 6 colleges:**
- **State Level Dialogue on Gender Perception in a Post Covid-19 Scenario in Rajasthan and Engaging with NSS Volunteers:** As mentioned above, BARC Trust organized this dialogue on December 27, 2022 at Hotel Ramada (Jaipur) for sharing preliminary findings on gender perceptions around roles and expectations from boys and girls in COVID-19 and way forward.

Workshop and Consultation on Agriculture Budget and Policy:

BARC, in collaboration with CBGA, organized one state level consultation and 3 district level consultations. BARC’s provided pro bono support in organizing the workshops. The state level consultation was organized in Jaipur and district consultations were organized in Udaipur, Alwar and Barmer districts.

Round Table on “Towards Inclusive and Cohesive Low-carbon Development in Rajasthan”:

BARC Trust collaborated with Centre for Budget and Governance Accountability (CBGA), New Delhi and BASK Research Foundation to organize a one-day Round Table on “Towards Inclusive and Cohesive Low-carbon Development in Rajasthan” at Hilton Hotel, Jaipur. The round was participated by Mr. Naveen Sharma (Officer on Special Duty) from Rajasthan Renewable Energy Corporation Ltd. (GoR), Mr. Danveer Verma (Deputy Director) from Horticulture Department (GoR), Prof. M. S. Rathore (Director) from CEDS, Jaipur and others. More than 30 people from the concerned departments of government, NGOs/CSOs, Academic and development organisations participated in the round table.

Collaboration and Networking

BARC Trust has always worked in collaboration with the various state level networks and organizations, such as the **Feminist Policy Collective, Peoples Budget Initiative, Right to Food Campaign, Suchna evam Rozgar Adhikar Abhiyan, Rajasthan Adivasi Adhikar Manch** etc. There have been a significant number of participants from state NGOs in BARC's pre-budget consultations and other programmes. During the year 2022-23, BARC collaborated with many organizations for conducting various research studies and interventions, as mentioned above. Apart from this, BARC Trust also participated in various meetings, seminars and advocacy initiatives undertaken by various organizations.

Centre for Dalit rights (CDR) and Suchana Evam Rojgar Adhikar Abhiyaan (SR Abhiyaan):

BARC Trust collaborated with Centre for Dalit rights, Suchana Evam Rojgar Adhikar Abhiyaan, Rajasthan Adivasi Adhikar Manch and Astha to organize a one-day consultation on Rajasthan Scheduled Castes Development Fund) and Scheduled Tribes Development Fund (Planning, Allocation, and Utilization of Financial Resources) Act, 2022" at Ambedkar Welfare Society, Jhalana (Jaipur) comprising of 40 to 50 participants.

Feminist Policy Collective: BARC Trust collaborated with the **Feminist Policy Collective** in organizing the pre-budget consultation for the union budget 2023-24.

Centre for Budget and Governance Accountability (CBGA): BARC Trust collaborated with Centre for Budget and Governance Accountability (CBGA), and organised meetings on agriculture policy, various issues on women and marginalized farmers, state action plan on climate change and climate change policy and renewable energy policy in the state.

Interns

This year BARC Trust received interns from Sophia College, Ajmer (Raj.), Azim Premji University (Bengaluru) and Central University of Rajasthan, Kishangarh (Raj.). The interns worked on different subjects e.g. women and gender budgeting, agriculture policies, status of education in Rajasthan, Sustainable Development Goals- SDGs and status of Rajasthan in achieving SDGs. Besides this, the interns were also involved in different research studies conducted on "Gender and Perspective around Roles and Expectations from Boys and Girls in 17 Districts of Rajasthan" and "Gender Sensitivity among the Young People in Sawai Modhopur District of Rajasthan: Baseline Assessment" by BARC Trust.

BARC as Resource Centre

As stated earlier, one of the roles that BARC Trust assumes is to be a Resource Centre for the NGOs/POs, as well as for the journalists, MLAs and the public at large. The Centre was set up to provide high quality research data and analysis to support advocacy efforts. During the year 2022-23 also BARC provided support to various organizations.

Various news articles quoted BARC's analysis of the state budget in their reports including in the newspapers. BARC members also published their articles in the newspapers and news portals.

Box: Organizational Development

- **Meeting cum Training of Internal Complaint Committee on Sexual Harassment at workplace**

BARC Trust has formed an Internal Complaint Committee on Sexual Harassment as mandated in The Sexual Harassment of Women at Workplace (Prevention, Prohibition and Redressal) Act, 2013. On October 3, 2022, the first Prevention of Sexual Exploitation and Abuse (PSEA) training session for the BARC team members was held, with an emphasis on understating the gender issues, including sexual harassment and gender discrimination, dimensions and forms of sexual harassment, and Vishaka Guidelines. And the second training was organized on BARC Trust's policy for Prevention of Sexual Harassment at Workplace for the BARC team members on March 18, 2023.

Website

BARC Trust's website (www.barctrust.org) has been created to help citizens and other organizations to find information about Rajasthan state's budget and public policies with a pro-poor and pro-marginalised peoples' perspective. As a portal for budget and policy related information, the site gives an overview of Rajasthan's socio-economic status, and provides a simplified understanding of the state's budget and policies over the years.

The website is structured to reflect our strategic focus. Apart from "About Us", which introduces the visitors to the Trust's Vision, Mission and Objectives, the site has sections on "Rajasthan Budget Data Simplified", which presents the Rajasthan government's budget data in a simpler form and the "Panchayat Budget" which introduces the visitors to the Trust's work with the Panchayats in the Tonk district of Rajasthan. The section on "Nutrition in Rajasthan" provides updated status of nutrition in the state, while the publication section provides all our publications online.

'Rajasthan's Budget Simplified' section has various data sheets on compiling state budget sector wise and various head wise, department wise budget, scheme wise budget and budget for health and nutrition as well as TSP and SC-SP budget, gender budget, budget for children, budget for SDGs etc.

A section on Covid-19 was added earlier with relevant information on government's relief measures and BARC's study reports and policy brief on Covid-19. New documents were added to the section during the year. Budget data section, nutrition section and

Covid-19 pages of the website have been updated during the year 2022-23.

To conclude...

BARC Trust has continued its effort towards achieving its objectives during the year 2022-23 as well. The state government passed the **“Rajasthan State Schedule Castes and Schedule Tribes Development Fund (Planning, Allocation and Utilization of Financial Resources) Act (2022)”** giving legal back up to the budget allocations for the Dalits and Tribals. Similarly, the state government passed the “Rajasthan Right to Health Care Act, 2022” in the state assembly on March 21, 2023. Both of these acts passed by GoR are a matter of satisfaction for the BARC Trust as BARC has been advocating for such legislations in the state for a long time.

The Publication of the series on the SDGs and Marginalised is also in important step in right direction as it will help in bringing the inequality and issues of marginalized communities in the SDGs debate.

BARC trust will continue its efforts to highlight the issues of disadvantaged people in the whole policy, budget and governance marginalised landscape.
